

The homes of Historic Centennial Neighborhood represent architectural styles from 1840's Greek Revival to Italianate to Queen Anne to 1920's Bungalows. In 1983, the Centennial Historic



District was listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The Wabash Valley Trust for Historic Preservation has awarded its "sycamore leaf" historic plaque to 34 Centennial buildings, attesting to the architectural significance of the neighborhood. Historic houses are continuing to provide homes for today's families. Historic architecture has also inspired the North 5th Street Brownstones and Rowhouses.







H istoric Centennial Neighborhood lies just north of downtown Lafayette. Platted in 1829, it is the oldest addition to the Town of Lafayette. The namesake and logo for the neighborhood is Centennial School, built in 1876 and razed in 1971. Its site (at North 6th and Brown Streets) is now the neighborhood's Centennial Park. Early development was influenced by the Wabash and Erie Canal (1843), and Lafayette's first railroad (1853), both of which traversed the neighborhood.

Historic Centennial Neighborhood has many activities for the entire family. We are home to:

- Eight houses of worship;
- Two parochial elementary schools in addition to New Community School;
- Wells Community Cultural Center--home of Tippecanoe Arts Federation;
- Centennial Park is located at the center of our neighborhood;



- Tippecanoe Arts Federation (TAF);
- YWCA;
- Imagination Station, an interactive children's museum of science, technology, and transportation; and
- Civic Theatre.
