Jenny Peterson is a new member of the neighborhood who lives on 6<sup>th</sup> St. Jenny is an employee of the City of Lafayette, and works on neighborhood stabilization. Jenny has worked on the Chatham Square project in Glen Acres, and explains that the Neighborhood Stabilization Program is a comprehensive plan designed to stem foreclosure, reduce blight and crime, empower residents and stimulate community investment. This can include parks, curbs, trails, and other things that help neighbors create a community.

After living in Barcelona, Spain, Jenny returned to her hometown of Lafayette and chose to live in Centennial. She says, "Growing up in the community (on 9<sup>th</sup> street hill) was a great experience. I wanted to be close to work, close to entertainment, and also have an environment where I felt safe to walk my dog (Oliver) or go for a run. Centennial seems like the downtown neighborhood that has the most to offer and also carries a rich history and character!"

## 3<sup>rd</sup> Street Construction

If you look at the corner of 3<sup>rd</sup> and Cincinnati, you will see enormous 66-inch pipes being installed under Cincinnati Street. This construction will eliminate a lot of polluted water that currently runs directly into the Wabash.



The pipe will divert the water to the Plaza storage facility. If there is a storm surge, there is an existing pipe that will allow overflow.
