Centennial Townhomes, a project at the corner of Fifth and Brown, is officially underway in Centennial Neighborhood. The site is set for demolition in a few months, and construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2013. The conceptual design shown above was created by Benjamin L. Ross.

North Street Reconstruction

This summer the city is beginning an important project on North Street that will prevent 80% of the area’s runoff from entering the sewer system. The bricks that line the street will be replaced with permeable pavers, and the old bricks will be salvaged, and reused for other city projects. Trees will be added and the sidewalks will be improved. You may have some inconvenience this year, but the result will save money, prevent pollution of the Wabash, and add beauty to the neighborhood. HCN supports the project.

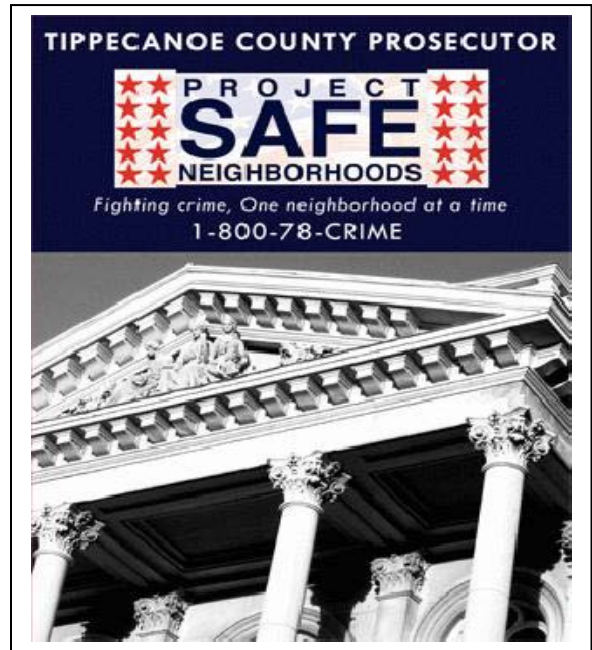
